THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following Decree of the President of the French Republic, extracted from the "Journal Officiel," modifying certain Customs' Dues in Senegal:—

Vu l'avis du ministre de l'agriculture et du commerce en date du 2 mai 1872 ;

Décrète :

Art. 1er. Les droits de douane existant au Sénégal et dans ses dépendances sont modifiés ainsi qu'il suit :

Droits à l'importation à Saint-Louis :

Armes et munitions du	
guerre	15 p. 100 de la valeur.
Tabacs en feuilles	10 p. 100 —
Autres marchandises ...	5 p. 100 —

Droits à l'exportation des dépendances de Gorée.
Produits coloniaux de toute provenance et de toute nature 5 p. 100 de la valeur.

Art. 2. Sont maintenues les dispositions qui ne sont pas contraires au présent décret.

Art. 3. Les ministres de la marine et des colonies et de l'agriculture et du commerce sont chargés, chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent décret, qui sera inséré au *Bulletin des lois* et au *Bulletin officiel de la marine*.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs copies of two Decrees of the Portuguese Government, dated the 5th ultimo, imposing import duties of 10 reis (0.53d.) per kilogramme on iron chains and cables that are not applicable to the fitting out, &c., of ships ; of 150 reis (8d.) per kilogramme on canvas and sail cloth applicable to other purposes than that of being made into ship's sails ; and of 30 per cent. ad valorem on buttons made of any vitrified substance or mass, and not included under manufactured articles either of glass or crystal, or of porcelain.

All these articles have hitherto been unenumerated in the Portuguese Tariff.
