THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto William Henry Wilson, of Adelphi, in the parish of Corofin, in the county of Clare, Gentleman, second son of Richard Bassett Wilson, late of Cliffe, in the North Riding of the county of York, Esquire, deceased, by Anne, his wife, younger of the two daughters and coheirs of William Fitzgerald, late of Adelphi aforesaid, Esquire, also deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of his maternal grandfather the said William Fitzgerald, take and use the surname of Fitzgerald, in addition to and after that of Wilson, and that he and they may bear the arms of Fitzgerald quarterly with his and their family arms; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect;

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Trebizond reporting "that an outbreak of cholera in Bessarabia, extending as far as Odessa, having been officially announced, all vessels and goods coming from the above-mentioned or from other ports on the Russian coast of the Black Sea, are, on arrival at Trebizond, or others on the Turkish coast of the said Sea, subject to a rigorous quarantine, as instituted for such cases."

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General in Egypt, reporting "that in consequence of the appearance of some cases of cholera at Odessa, the Board of Health have decided that all vessels from Russian ports of the Black Sea, with bills of health bearing an annotation as to the cases referred to, and which may not have performed their ten days' quarantine at Constantinople shall be subjected to ten days' quarantine in Egyptian ports."

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Lisbon, forwarding Notices from the Consultative Board of Public Health, by which it appears:—

1st. That the Port of Bahia is declared "infected" with yellow fever since the 15th of May last, and all the other ports of that province are declared "suspected" of that disease since that date.

2nd. That the Port of Monte Video, which was considered "infected" with yellow fever in the terms of the Notice of the 22nd April last, is now declared "suspected" of the same disease since 27th May last.

3rd. That the Port of Macció is declared "infected" with yellow fever since 22nd May last, and the other ports of the province of Alagoas are declared "suspected" of that disease since that date.

4th. That the ports of the Sea of Azoff and of Constantinople are declared "suspected" of cholera morbus since 22nd June last.

5th. That the ports of the Black Sea are declared "suspected" of cholera morbus since 23rd June.
