Fixed Red Light on Carleton Point.

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Carleton Point, Chaleur Bay.

The light is a *fixed red* light, elevated 32 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 12 miles.

Fog Signal at Point Año Nuevo.

THE United States Government has given notice, that a steam fog-whistle has been established at the island off Point Año Nuevo, in lat. 37° 6' 30" N., long. 122° 19' W. In thick or foggy weather the whistle will sound *fifteen seconds*, followed by an interval of *forty-five seconds*.

Reef off Maria Island.

THE Colonial Government of South Australia has given notice of the existence of a reef, *Meikleham Reef*, off Maria Island in Limmen's Bight, Gulf of Carpentaria, and lying in the track of vessels bound for Roper River.
