THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Madrid, stating that a Decree has been issued by the Spanish Minister of the Interior, subjecting to quarantine all vessels that shall have sailed from ports on the Prussian and Russian coasts of the Baltic and the Gulf of Finland after the 17th July last.

The Board of Trade have also received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Christiania, stating that a Circular has been sent by the Norwegian Department of the Interior to the respective local authorities along the coasts to the effect :--

"That until further notice the following places are to be considered as cholera smitten; viz.:--

"St. Petersburg, Cronstadt, and Helsingfors, Odessa and Russian harbours in the Black Sea and Sea of Azoff."

"Vessels having cholera patients on board destined to any port in the south of Norway are to be conducted by the pilots either to the quarantine station at Christiansund or Frederiksvorn; in all other ports masters will be compelled to retain their patients on board, and, in the meanwhile, to lie in quarantine."
