

THE estates of Mouat and Shearer, sometime Clothiers, No. 62, North Bridge, Edinburgh, and of John Mouat, Bonnington Grove Villa, Bonnington, and James Shearer, Bonnington Grove Villa, Bonnington, the Individual Partners of that Company, now dissolved, as Partners thereof, and as Individuals, were sequestrated on the 24th day of September, 1872, by the Court of Session.
