The 10th inftant the Sieur Carrich, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Bavaria, artited here from Municke, with the original Bull'by which the Pope confirms the Election of Prince Clement of Bavaria to this Archbilhoprick; The i2th it was published in the Cathedral Church, and then Te Deum being fung, the Prince de Croy, one of the Canons, having a Procuration from the faid Frince for that purpose, took polletion in his name of this Archbishoprick and Electorate, and afterwards of the Archiepifcopal Palace, with the requifite Solemnity, though none of the Canons of the Cardinal's Party were prefent at it; But we are told The Committioners in the Committioners in the Committioners of Bankrupt, Awar-that feveral of them that were with him at Bonne are fince this Publication retired from thence. The French Minifter continues to prefs these Magistrates to accept of the Neutrality he has proposed to them. We hear that 3400 Men of the Forces that were en-camped under the Committioner the Continuent of the Marefchal d'Hu-camped under the Command of the Marefchal d'Hu-

mieres, between the Sambre and the Meufe, arrived the 12th inftant at Miclick, the reft of the Troops being returned to the Garifons from whence they were drawn. This Detachement raffed through the Country of Luxemburg and Treves, and Comes it's believed to reinforce the French Troops quartered in this Electorate.

Spire, Octob. 16. The Belieged in Philipsburg defend themfelves very vigoroufly; they made the 14th instant a furious Sally, and it's faid that 4 or you of the French were killed. The latter fuffer likewife very much by the Rains, being up to the middle in Water in their Trenches. They have put the Countreys of Wittemberg, Franconia, and Sua-bia, under Contributions. A Regiment of Foot of the Forces of the Landtgrave of Heffe Caffel is arrived at Francfort.

Hamburg, Octob. 18. We hear from Berlin, That the Elector of Brandenburg has, upon the News of the March of the French Forces, given Orders for the railing deveal new Regiments. The Princes of Lunienburg do likewife raile Men. The Troops of Saxony are Encamped at Tor-gau to the number of 13000 Men, from whence 6 Regi-

gav to the number of 13000 min, non marked a sup-ments are ordered to march towards the *Rinne*. *Bruffels*, Octob. 19. Our Governoun-General has refol-ved to raile ten new Regiments, 4 of Horle, 4 of Dra-goons, and 2 of Foot, which are to be all compleat within Markha, his Evcellence provides the Horles and Arms 2 Months; his Excellency provides the Hories and Arms, but the Officers are to Levy and Cloath the Men at their own Charge. They write from Frazefart of the 14th own Charge. They write from Francfort of the 14th inftant, That the Siege of Philipsburg goes on very flowly, by reafon of the Difficulties the French daily meet with; their Bridge over the Rhine being broken, and their Batterics ready to fwim, all being overflowed quite round the place. We hear from Gologne, That the Pope's Bull, con-firming the Election of Prince Clement, had been published there, and that the Prince de Groy had thereupon, in his name, taken Posselion of that Archbishoprick. The Mareschal d'Humieres, who was encamped between the Sambre and the Meuse, is returning with his Troops into the new Conquests.

Bruffels, Octob. 22. The new Colonels are very bufie in preparing for their Levies. His Excellency has like, wite refolved to add 4 Companies to each of the old Walloon Regiments. We are told from Spire, That the Garifon of Philipsburg makes a very brave Defence, and that on the 14th they made a vigorous Sally, wherein the French loft a great many men, with some Officers of note.
