Alteration in Lights at Naples.

THE Italian Government has given notice, that from the 17th day of October, 1872, the following alterations would be made in the lights at Naples.

The fixed and flashing light on St. Vincent Mole would be moved to the extremity of the mole, and flashes shown every thirty seconds instead of every minute, and the temporary fixed red light at the extremity of the mole would be discontinued.

The green light at the extremity of St. Gennaro Mole, of the Mercantile Port, would be obscured in the direction of St. Vincent Mole, terminating at the extremity of the new foundation of the mole, in order that the light may be visible to vessels passing the mole.

## Harbour Light at Cotrone.

Also, that a white light, supended from an iron bracket fixed on a house, is now exhibited at the extremity of the Great Mole at Cotrone. The light is elevated 23 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 2 mile3.

## Fixed Red Light on Daxa Rock, Gravosa.

Also, that from the 13th October, 1872, a light would be exhibited on the north end of Daxa, entrance of Port Gravosa.

The light is a *fixed red* light elevated 51 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 5 miles.

The light would be exhibited from a pole near the keeper's dwelling. Position, lat. 42° 40′ N., long. 18° 3′ E.
