

to produce the annual sum of eleven thousand pounds, the net income derived by them from such estates, and from the estates hereby proposed to be reserved to and to be transferred to them, including any interest paid to them by us in respect of the monies proposed to be set apart by us as aforesaid for the purposes of repairs and drainage on the said estates shall, after payment of all outgoings and charges on such income, be annually divided by them into twenty-six parts, which twenty-six parts shall be appropriated in perpetuity as follows, that is to say, three of such parts for the income of the Dean, six of such parts for the income of the six Canons, three of such parts for the maintenance of the said school, and the repairs of the said school buildings, and the remaining fourteen of such parts shall be applied to defraying the expenses of maintaining the services of the said church, the repairs of the fabric thereof, and of the buildings

belonging thereto, and all the other expenses and liabilities chargeable upon the corporate revenues of the Dean and Chapter: Provided always, that if the whole of the three parts to be appropriated to the maintenance of the school, or of the fourteen parts to be appropriated to the maintenance of the fabric and services, and other purposes respectively as aforesaid, be not in any one year expended on the objects to which they are respectively applicable, the surplus remaining in every such case shall be accumulated and applied to the same respective objects in a subsequent year or subsequent years.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the said Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.
