approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Ravenfield.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Eccleshall, in the county of Stafford, and in the diocese of Lichfield, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all those tithes commutation rent-charges which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us, to have and to hold the said tithe commutation rent-charges to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the said tithe commutation rent-charges shall be and be held to be in lieu of, and in full substitution for, an annual sum or stipend of twenty-eight pounds, heretofore payable by us the said Commissioners to the Incumbent of the said vicarage in respect of certain property formerly belonging to the Bishoprick of Lichfield, to which substitution the Reverend Charles Patten Good, Clerk, the present Incumbent of the said vicarage, is consenting, and in token thereof has signed this instrument: And provided also that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said tithe commutation rent-charges, for and in respect of the period intervening between the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.
