laft Letters from Balmatia inform us, that the Proveditor-General Cornaro was on his march towards Narcusa, with a delign to make himself Master of that Fortcels, before he put his Troops into Winter-quarters. The Duke of Mantua is arrived at Padua in his return from Hungary.

Vienna, Octob. 10. The Emperor has given Ortlers for the railing 20 New Regiments, 10 of Garmans, and 10 of Hungarians and Croats, and fome of the Officers have already begun their Levies, The Turkish Ambassadors are arrived at Pettendorf, about five Leagues from hence, where General Caraffa is to receive their Proposals. We have an Account from B stgrade, that 2000 Rafcians who were posted at a place called Maola, about four Leagues on the other fide of Semandrig, making Exourfions towards the River Trina, had furprized a confiderable open Town called Zalkolow and had afterwards had a rencounter with three Thousand Turks, of whom a thouland were killed upon the place, and the reft put to flight; Upon this fucces, the Rascians marching down the Danube, took three confiderable Caftles fituated near that Rivers about 20 Leagues from Belgrade ; To fecure thefe Acquificions, General Caprara fent Major General Heusler with fix Regiments to Bodziarawaz, a place of good defence on the River Morana, with Orders to post himfelf there, and to affift the Rafcians with fach Detachements as he should think fit. The Auxiliary Troops of Bawaria, and of Franconia, and Suabia,

are on their march homeward. Vienna, Octob. 14. The Elector of Bavaria, after ha-ving affitted at the Conferences that have been held here upon the Arrival of feveral Expresses from Germany, parted from hence the 10th instant for Municke. There will be formed a Body of Germans, Hungarians, and Croats, who are to act on the Rhine under the Command of General Dunewalt; and to shorten their, way they will take their March through Stiria. Commillions are daily given out for new Levies, which the Officers are obliged to have compleat within two Months, General Gaprara having given the necellary Orders for the Security of Betbis Government of Waradin; But the Generals Palf and Heufer are to act with Detachements in Servia and Raf-cia as long as the Scafon will permit. The Troops of Heigher are to act with Detachments in Service and Kaj-cia as long as the Scalon will permit. The Troops of Francous and Suabis are palled by Buda, in their march homeward, and are expected here in few days, the Empe-ror having appointed Commillaries to conduct them to the Frontiers of the Empire. The Turkilla Ambaliadors, who are at the Caffle of Pstrendorf, refue to declare the Propolals they are charged with, till they have had Audience of the Emperor, which it's believed will not be really granted them. cally granted them

Hamburg, Octob. 19. They writs from Stock-bolm, That the King of Sueden was returned thither from vifting his Fleet at Carefferoon, and his Troops in Schenen, We hear from Berlin, That the Elector of Brandenburg has given out Com-mifilons for the raifing of leveral new Regiments. The Letters from Poland confirm the News we had of the Retreat of the Polish Army from before Ca. miniec.

Francfort, Octob. 21. The 19th Inftant arrived here the Sieur Role from the Elector of Saxony, to walfure these Magistrates of his Affistance, and that We had already ordered feveral Regiments to march for that purpole. They have received the like affutances from the Elector of Brandenburg. The French have put the Counties of Hanau, Solma, Darinftade, and the adjacent Country under Con-tribution. We are told from the Camp before Phi-Tribution. kysbourg, that the French fuffer very much, by the overflowing of the Rhine, and that the Befieged defend themfelves very vigoroufly.

Cologne, Octob. 21. The Letters from Treves of the 18th Inflant, tell us, That City had received a The Letters from Treves of French Garison of 2000 Men, under the Command of the Sieur de Gournay. There is likewife a French Garifon in Mayence. The Maglitrates of this City

have not yet taken a final resolution upon the Prepolals that have been made to them by the French Minister concerning a Neutrality.

Hague Oft. 22. The Troops are now all on Ship-board; And the Prince of Orange will embark himfelf to foon as the Ships from the Texel have join'd with those of the Maefe. The States have Published a Placaet, prohibiting the Importation of French Commodities during the Arreft that is laid upon all Dutch Ships in the Ports of France. The Imperial Minister has given in a Memorial, defiring the Affiftance of this State for the Security of Cologne; upon which Prince Waldeck is ordered to march towards the Frontiers, to give that City all the Affiftance he can.
