## WEASENHAM ST. PETER'S FAIR.

By Memorial, dated the 4th day of December, 1872, a representation has been duly made to me by the Justices sitting in Petty Sessions for the Launditch Division of the county of Norfolk, that a Fair has been annually held on the 25th day of January, on the Village Green in the parish of Weasenham St. Peter's, commonly known as "Powell's" or "Paul's Mart," in the said division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be abolished.

2. On the 16th day of January, 1873, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fair.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Justices sitting in Petty Sessions for the Division of Witham, in the county of Essex, that a Fair has been annually held on the 17th and 18th days of June, in the parish of Cressing, in the said division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I should take the same into consideration, has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1871:"

And whereas, on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1871," do hereby order that the Fair which has been annually held on the 17th and 18th days of June, in the parish of Cressing, in the Witham Petty Sessional Division of the county of Essex, shall be abolished as from date of this order.
