THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Consul at Martinique, a Despatch, intimating that the Executive in the Island has given its approval to the Tariff in respect of the dock at Fort de France which has recently been fixed by the General Council of the Colony.

A copy of the Tariff is subjoined :-

TARIFF of Charges on Ships of all Flags coming into the Dock at Fort de France.

Tonnage dues, pilotage, light and harbour fees not exacted.

Vessels for the dock only pay a nominal tax of of 11f. 25c. (say nine shillings sterling).

Entry per ton ... 3 50

Each day after the dock has been emptied and per ton ... 0 90

Shores and shoring per ton once paid 0 15

A reduction of 50 per cent. will be made on the surplus tonnage of vessels beyond 2000 tons.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Notification of the Russian Government, announcing that from the 1st January, 1873, the importation into Russia of skins and furs of the sea otter will be permitted, subject to the delivery of securities guaranteeing the payment of Customs' duties when definitely fixed by the Council of the Empire, in such manner that one half of the duties will be payable immediately after the decision of the Council, and the other half in the manner prescribed by the Annex to the Article 858 of the Customs' Regulations.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Lisbon, forwarding a copy of a notice issued by the Portuguese Home Department, declaring the Port of Ceará to be free from yellow fever since the 21st September last, and the Port of Aracaty to be "suspected" of the same disease since the same date.
