NOTICE is hereby given to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested therein, that the distribution of the tonnage bounty and proceeds for a slave dhow, name unknown, captured on the 31st March, 1871, by Her Majesty's ship "Wolverene," will commence on Friday, the 10th proximo, in the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-

General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset House."

Personal applications by persons entitled to share, and by agents and other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share of any captor serving in the above-named ship, are to be made at the Prize Branch of the Admiralty, Somerset House.

Any Officer, Seaman, Marine, or other person, who may desire to receive his share from the Collector of Customs or of Inland Revenue within the United Kingdom, is required to intimate the same by letter to be addressed "On Prize Business, to the Accountant-General of the Navy and Comptroller of Navy Pay, Admiralty, S.W." (enclosing his certificate of service, or an attested copy thereof, excepting in the case of Commissioned Officers),—in which letter his own place of residence is to be precisely stated, as well as the place of the nearest Collector of Customs, or of Inland Revenue, from whom it would be convenient to receive such share of prize money.

Baldwin Brightwell Corn Rent.

IN pursuance of the directions contained in an Act of Parliament passed in the forty-second year of the reign of King George the Third, "for dividing, allotting, and inclosing the open and common fields and other commonable and waste lands within the parish of Baldwin Brightwell, in the county of Oxford," I, Catherine Charlotte Lowndes Stone Norton, owner and proprietor of the allotments charged with the payment of the yearly rent or sum hereinafter mentioned, do hereby give notice, that application will be made to the first Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held in and for the said county of Oxford, in the week first after the close of the Feast of Easter, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three (namely, on the 8th day of April in that year), to have two persons named and appointed by the Justices then and there assembled, to be, together with a third person to be named and chosen by such two persons, arbitrators or referees for inquiring into and ascertaining, by the means in the said Act mentioned, the average price of an imperial bushel (the Winchester bushel having been abolished by law) of good marketable wheat, within the said county of Oxford, for the fourteen years then last past, in order that the said arbitrators or referees, or the major part of them, shall, by their report, to be made and delivered to the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in the first week after the Feast of St. Thomas the Martyr then next ensuing (namely, on the 6th day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four), set forth such average price, to the end that the yearly rent or sum payable to the rector of the said parish in
