Exhibition—or if the application should have been made after that date, from the day of making the application—until the 31st December, 1873, inclusive, the same rights and privileges which a Patent, obtained in the regular course, or a duly obtained Registration for the protection of a Trade Mark, Design, or Model, would grant him. The Exhibitor is reserved the right to apply to the appointed authorities, before the day of expiration of the "Certificate of Protection," for a Patent, or the protection of the Trade Mark or Design, for the same object or objects, according to the provisions of the laws mentioned in Art. I.

#### ART. III.

### No appeal is allowed against the Director-General's decision.

No appeal or complaint will be admitted against the decision of the Director-General respecting the granting or refusal of such "Certificate of Protection."

In case the validity of any of the "Certificates of Protection" should be disputed, the competent authorities will have to decide the question according to the existing Patent Laws.

### ART. IV.

# Double Registers of Applications and Certificates issued will be kept.

A double Register will be kept by the Director-General of the Universal Exhibition of the applications for "Certificates of Protection" and of the Certificates issued, of which, after the close of the Exhibition, one with the aforesaid applications and a copy of the specifications attached to them, as also of the Trade Marks, Designs, and Models, will be lodged with the Imperial and Royal Ministry of Commerce; and the other, with copies of the application and other appendices, with the Royal Hungarian Ministry for Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce.

#### ART. V.

Certificates of Protection will be published in the Austrian and Hungarian Official Gazettes. The Registers will be open for inspection to every one. Secrecy will be observed, if desired.

The "Certificates of Protection" issued will be published in the Austrian and Hungarian Official Gazettes. The inspection of the Register of "Certificates of Protection" is open to every one, but the specifications, plans, models, &c., will be kept secret, if it be so desired in the application.

## ART. VI.

The Minister of Commerce is charged with the execution of this Law.
