WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Binsted with Kingsley, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all those pieces or parcels of land and hereditaments, with the messuage or tenement and buildings standing and being thereon, together with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us, to have and to hold the said pieces or parcels of land, hereditaments, and buildings, with the appurtenances, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said pieces or parcels of land and hereditaments, for and in respect of the period intervening between the twenty-ninth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of Ryde, in the Isle of Wight, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and twenty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the ninth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and to be receivable in four equal portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November, in each and every year: Provided always, that the annual sum or stipend so granted by us to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Ryde, shall

be paid only upon the production to us on or after each of the said lastly-mentioned days in each and every year, of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, that an Assistant Curate, duly licensed by such Bishop, has been employed within the parish of Ryde aforesaid during the quarter of the year then ended, and is in receipt of a salary after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided also, that such yearly sum or stipend shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said vicarage and parish of Ryde.
