approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her
Majesty's Treasury:—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the
General Regulations of 8th April, 1872), res-
pecting Open Competitive Examinations for
the situation of Assistant of Excise in the
Department of Inland Revenue.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 19
and 22; and candidates must be of the prescribed
age on the first day of the month in which the
Examination is held.

2. Candidates must be unmarried and without
family.

3. The Examination will be in the following
subjects; viz. :—

	Marks.
1. Handwriting	200
2. Orthography	200
3. Arithmetic (to Vulgar and Deci- mal Fractions)	300
4. English Composition	200

4. Candidates failing in any of the above-
named subjects will not be eligible.

5. Application for permission to attend an
examination must be made at such times and in
such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.

6. A fee of 15s. will be required from each
Candidate attending the Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give
notice, that Open Competitive Examinations,
under the above Regulations will, until further
notice, be held half-yearly in the months of June
and December. Persons wishing to compete at
the Examination to be held in June next, should
apply at once for the necessary form to the

**METROPOLIS LOCAL MANAGEMENT
ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1862.**

25 and 26 Vict., cap. 102, sect. 41.

Metropolitan Board of Works.

AT a Meeting of the Board, at their Office,
Spring-gardens, this twenty-first day of February,
one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three,
amongst the Orders is as follows:—

Whereas, by the Metropolis Management
Amendment Act, 1862, it is enacted that when at
any time, upon any account taken of the popula-
tion by the authority of Parliament, any of the
parishes within the metropolis not then divided
into wards, for the purpose of electing vestrymen,
should be found to contain more than two thousand
rated householders, it should be lawful for the
Metropolitan Board of Works, upon the applica-
tion, in writing, of the Vestry, or of not less than
five hundred rated householders of the parish, to
divide such parish into wards, and to determine
and set out the number, extent, limits, and
boundary lines of such wards, but so, nevertheless,
that the whole number of wards shall not exceed
eight; and the Metropolitan Board should apportion
among the several wards the number of
vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and
should, in assigning the number of vestrymen to
each ward, have regard, as far as in their judgment
was practicable, as well to the number of persons
rated to the relief of the poor in each ward, as to
the aggregate amount of the sums at which all
such persons are rated; and the number of vestry-
men assigned to each ward should be a number
divisible by three: And whereas the Vestry of
the parish of Saint Mary, Battersea, has recently
applied to us, the Metropolitan Board of Works,
in writing, stating that the parish of Battersea is
comprised within the limits of the Metropolis
Local Management Act, and is one of the parishes
in the Wandsworth District in Schedule B of
that Act, that at the time of the passing of the
same Act the number of the rated householders
in the parish of Battersea was less than two
thousand; and consequently that the parish was
not divided into wards, and that the number of
rated householders had increased very considerably
beyond two thousand, and the said Vestry there-
fore prayed that we, the Metropolitan Board of
Works would be pleased to take steps, in pur-
suance of the powers vested in the Board by the
