REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is

Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

HER Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Lord Lytton, Her Majesty's Minister at Paris, the subjoined extract from the "Journal Officiel" of the 4th of May.

Versailles, 3 Mai, 1873.

La commission chargée, par arrêté ministériel du 29 novembre, 1871, de procéder au règlement des dommages résultant des opérations d'attaque dirigées par l'armée française pour rentrer dans Paris, clôturera très-prochainement ses travaux.

Les intéressés recevront alors des certificats nominatifs constatant leurs droits. Ces titres provisoires seront échangés ultérieurement, et à une époque qui sera fixée par le conseil municipal, contre des titres définitifs.

Des lettres individuelles feront connaître aux ayants droit à quelle époque aura lieu la remise des certificats.

La loi du 7 avril, 1873, ayant mis le paiement de cette indemnité à la charge de la ville de Paris, toutes les oppositions, les transports, les cessions devront être signifiés, sous peine de nullité, au receveur municipal de la ville de Paris (palais du Luxembourg).

Toutes les significations faites précédemment au Trésor public devront être renouvelées entre les mains du receveur municipal de la ville de Paris, pour qu'elles aient leur effet sur les sommes qui doivent être payées par la ville.

Versailles, May 3, 1873.

The Commission charged by Ministerial Decree of the 29th of November, 1871, with the assess-

ment of the amount of damages arising out of the siege operations carried on by the French army with a view to the recapture of Paris, will very shortly close its labours.

The persons interested will then receive certificates setting forth their names and the nature of their claims.

These provisional vouchers will eventually be exchanged against formal vouchers at such time as may be fixed by the Municipal Council.

Letters will be addressed to each individual claimant setting forth the time of issue of the vouchers.

The law of the 7th April, 1873, having assigned the payment of this indemnity to the town of Paris, all counter claims, removals, and cessions, will have to be notified, under pain of forfeiture, to the Receveur-Municipal of the town of Paris, at the Luxembourg Palace.

All the claims previously notified to the Treasury will have to be renewed to the Receveur-Municipal of the town of Paris, in order that they may be charged against the sums of money to be disbursed by the town.
