TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

#### By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, the following instructions which have been sent to the Governors of the Maritime Provinces :--

"According to the last sanitary reports from our foreign representatives the yellow fever has developed itself in Pernambuco and in Bahia, and some cases of the same illness have presented themselves in Mareio, Brazil.

"Wherefore you will consider as foul vessels coming from the two first mentioned places which put to sea since the 22nd of last March, and submit to three days of observation those which left the last after the 4th of April of the current year."

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Monte Video, reporting that there is no appearance of diminution in the fatal epidemic of yellow fever which is prevailing in that city, in consequence of which commerce is entirely suspended, and all public offices have been removed to the outskirts of the town, except the Custom-house, which will probably be closed shortly. There have as yet been few cases of fever in the shipping of the port.

3. No Candidate will be eligible whose age on the first day of the Examination is less than 19 or more than 25.

### SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.— Dated 30th day of November, 1872.
