peseta (5d.) per metrical ton on merchandize for foreign ports in Europe, Asia in the Mediterranean, and Africa to Cape Mogador, one peseta (10d.) per metrical ton on merchandize shipped for all ports beyond Cape Mogador.

The above-mentioned dues are additional to those hitherto leviable for which see Commercial Report on the Balearic Islands for the year 1870.
