## Venice, Novemb. 5.

HE Letters from the Venetian Camp before Negropont, of the Tenth of the laft Month, give an Account, That they continued the Siege of that place with all polfible Vigour; But that on the other fide the Belieged defended themfelves with great Refolution and Obstinacy, making frequent and numerous Salleys to regain the Ditch where our Men had lodged themfelves, being affifled and animated by the Succours which had got into the Town on the fide of the Fort Carababa; but that the Venetians, to prevent their receiving any farther Relief that way, were going to attack the faid Fort, having received a confiderable Reinforcement from the Morea; and at the fame time continued their Attacks against Negrepont, which were advanced to far that they intended in three or four days to make a General Affault. The Galleys of Maltha were gone home, having loft 23 Knights in this Siege: The Lieutenant-General, Marquis de Courbon, was killed with a Cannon Shot, and many other brave Officers of the Troops of Malta were killed or wounded.

Madrid, Novemb. 4, The Count de Guaro is arrived here from Oran, with an account that the Moors were at laft refired out of the Neighborhood of that place, not being able to fublift there any longer, the Country round being entirely ruined. We are told from Cadiz, That the Vice-Admiral Papachine was failed from thence with 6 Men of War, to meet the New-Spain Fleet that are expected home; and that the Chevalier de Chasteau-Renaud continued in that Bay with the French Squadron under his Command. Several Express have of late arrived here from Flanders and Germany.

The Circular Letters are given out for the holding the Provincial Dyets on the fifth of the next Month, to chufe the Deputies to be fent to the General Diet of the Kingdom, which is to meet here the 17th of December. The Advices from Walachia put us into fome uncafinels; They tell us, that a great Body of Tartars, commanded by the Cham in Perfori, was come into Bellevela, to countenance the Coffacks, who feem inclind to take up Arms againft this Crown, pretending, that fome Money which was promifted them has not been paid.

Vienna, Novemb. 4. The Turkifh Ambaffadors perfit in their Refufal of delivering the Grand Sign nior's Letter till they be admitted to their Audé ence of the Emperor, but they have given General Caraffa, who was fent to Paffendorf to confer with them, a Copy of it, which his Imperial Majefty has ordered to be communicated to his Allies. It contains the Notice of the prefent Sultan's coming to the Throne, and his defire to re-eftablish a firm advance with good Success.

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Peace and Friendhip with the imperor and the other, Chaffian Princes his Neighbours: The Auxiliary Troopsion Eurograden Eragunan, and Suabra, are expected to moreow in the Heighborhood of this City, in their March homeward. They are to have a Sum of Money in deus fully Winter-Quar-ters that were adigned them in Hargary. The Emperor has given Orders for the Hypenting each Regiatent of Horle in his Service with 200 Men, and each Regiment of Foot with 50c. We have advice from Croatia, That the Count de Herberfleur, Governor of Carelfladt, having attackt the Fortreis of Wahatz, in which there was a Gariton of 1000 Men, he had, after a Siege of eight days theen forced to quit that Enterprize, by reason the Groatian Militia, who had got a great deal of Booty, would continue no longer in the Field, but that before his Retreat he had lent out a firong Party of Germans to make an Incurfion towards the River Unna, who had the good Fortune to meet with, and to defeat, 1000 Turks, commanded by Mehemet Aga, an Officer of great Reputation among them, 300 of the Enemy being killed and wounded, and the Aga himfelt taken Prisoner, with some other Officers, who were carried to Carelftat. The Garifons of Sigeth and Canifa are reduced to great necessities.

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Francfort, Nov. 14. The Elector of Saxony marches this way with 12000 Men: He had the 12 inftant his head Quarter at Hungfield, and yefterday at Neuenbody and we are told that the Duke of Hanouer is likewife on his March with a Body of Lunenburgers to joyn him.
