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Venice, Novemb. 5.

THE Letters from the Venetian Camp before *Negrepont*, of the Tenth of the last Month, give an Account, That they continued the Siege of that place with all possible Vigour; But that on the other side the Besieged defended themselves with great Resolution and Obstinacy, making frequent and numerous Salleys to regain the Ditch where our Men had lodged themselves, being assisted and animated by the Succours which had got into the Town on the side of the Fort *Carababa*; but that the Venetians, to prevent their receiving any farther Relief that way, were going to attack the said Fort, having received a considerable Reinforcement from the *Morea*; and at the same time continued their Attacks against *Negrepont*, which were advanced so far that they intended in three or four days to make a General Assault. The Gallies of *Malta* were gone home, having lost 23 Knights in this Siege: The Lieutenant-General, Marquis *de Courbon*, was killed with a Cannon Shot, and many other brave Officers of the Troops of *Malta* were killed or wounded.

Madrid, Novemb. 4. The Count *de Guaro* is arrived here from *Oran*, with an account that the Moors were at last retired out of the Neighborhood of that place, not being able to subsist there any longer, the Country round being entirely ruined. We are told from *Cadix*, That the Vice-Admiral *Papachino* was sailed from thence with 6 Men of War, to meet the *New-Spain* Fleet, that are expected home; and that the Chevalier *de Chasteau-Renaud* continued in that Bay with the French Squadron under his Command. Several Expresses have of late arrived here from *Flanders* and *Germany*.

Warsaw, Octob. 30. The King of *Poland* parted from *Jawarow* the 21st Instant on his return hither. The Circular Letters are given out for the holding the Provincial Dyets on the fifth of the next Month, to chuse the Deputies to be sent to the General Diet of the Kingdom, which is to meet here the 17th of *December*. The Advices from *Walachia* put us into some uneasiness; They tell us, that a great Body of Tarrars, commanded by the Cham in Person, was come into *Besserabia*, with a design, as 'twas believed, to countenance the Cossacks, who seem inclin'd to take up Arms against this Crown, pretending, that some Money which was promised them has not been paid.

Vienna, Novemb. 4. The Turkish Ambassadors persist in their Refusal of delivering the Grand Signior's Letter till they be admitted to their Audience of the Emperor, but they have given General *Caraffa*, who was sent to *Paffendorf* to confer with them, a Copy of it, which his Imperial Majesty has ordered to be communicated to his Allies. It contains the Notice of the present Sultan's coming to the Throne, and his desire to re-establish a firm

Peace and Friendship with the Emperor and the other Christian Princes his Neighbours. The Auxiliary Troops of *Evagria*, *Amma*, and *Suabia*, are expected to morrow in the Neighborhood of this City, in their March homeward; They are to have a Sum of Money in lieu of the Winter-Quarters that were assigned them in *Hungary*. The Emperor has given Orders for the augmenting each Regiment of Horse in his Service with 200 Men, and each Regiment of Foot with 500. We have advice from *Croatia*, That the Count *de Herberstein*, Governor of *Careffstadt*, having attackt the Fortresses of *Wibitz*, in which there was a Garrison of 1000 Men, he had, after a Siege of eight days, been forced to quit that Enterprize, by reason the *Croatian* Militia, who had got a great deal of Booty, would continue no longer in the Field, but that before his Retreat he had sent out a strong Party of Germans to make an Incurfion towards the River *Umma*, who had the good Fortune to meet with, and to defeat, 1000 Turks, commanded by *Mehemet* Aga, an Officer of great Reputation among them, 300 of the Enemy being killed and wounded, and the Aga himself taken Prisoner, with some other Officers, who were carried to *Careffstat*. The Garrisons of *Sigetb* and *Canisa* are reduced to great necessities.

Francfort, Nov. 14. The Elector of *Saxony* marches this way with 12000 Men: He had the 12 instant his head Quarter at *Hungfield*, and yesterday at *Neuenbos*; and we are told that the Duke of *Hanouer* is likewise on his March with a Body of *Lunenburghers* to joyn him. The Garrison of *Manheim* surrendered the 13th instant. The French do now attack *Frankendall*. The Marquis *de Boufflers*, after having Bombarded *Coblentz*, is retired from thence. The Country of the Landtgrave of *Hesse Darmstadt* is put under Contribution.

Hamburg, Novemb. 10. The *Lunenbourg* Troops designed towards the *Rhine* began their March the 5th instant, and were followed the 7th by Lieutenant-General *Chavost*, who intended to be the 8th at *Erfurt*. Some *Lunenbourg* Troops are likewise marching towards the *Elbe*. They write from *Berlin*, That the Elector of *Brandenburg* intended to go and pass some time at *Cleves*; and that his Regiment of Guards was already marching that way. The Letters from *Stockholm* of the 17th past advise, That the King of *Sweden* was returned thither from *Schonen*, and had given Audience to an Envoy from the Princes of *Lunenbourg*, who had represented to his Majesty the present State of Affairs on this side, and had desired to know his Resolutions thereupon. We hear from *Copenhagen*, That the new Levies the King of *Denmark* had ordered to be made, advance with good Success.
