THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Tunis, forwarding a copy of the Regulations of the Sanitary Board, which order that every vessel carrying passengers whose number is not specified in its bill of health will be subjected to a quarantine of observation of five or seven days; and furthermore, every captain whose ship's papers do not correspond with the number of passengers on board his ship, will render himself liable to a fine of from fifty to five hundred francs (£2 to £20), besides six pence a day for every passenger landed in Tunis to defray the expenses of the quarantine of observation, unless he allows the passengers to perform their quarantine on board his vessel.

CHICHESTER FAIRS.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows :

1. By Memorial, dated the 28th day of April, 1873, a representation has been duly made to me by the Justices acting in and for the city of Chichester, that Fairs have been annually held on the 4th day of May and on Whit Monday in the said city, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs should be abolished.

2. On the 5th day of August, 1873, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fairs.

(No. 56.)—JAPAN—YEZO ISLAND.

(1.) Fixed Light on Cape Noyshap.

THE Japanese Government has given notice, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Cape Noyshap, east point of Yezo Island.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 74 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 6 miles.

The tower, built of wood, is 31 feet high, hexagonal shaped, and painted white. Position, lat. 43° 21' N., long. 145° 45' E.

(2.) Fixed Light at Nemoro.

Also, that a light is now exhibited from a wooden post on the N.E. extremity of Benten-sima, south-west side of the entrance to Nemoro Anchorage.

The light is a *fixed red* light, elevated 75 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 6 miles.

Position, lat. 43° 20' 30" N., long. 145° 35' E.

Both the above lights are exhibited from the 1st April to 31st October, in each year.

CHINA.—EAST COAST.—YUNG RIVER ENTRANCE.
 (3.) Fog Signal on Tse-Le (Square) Island and Tiger Island.

A fog bell has been established at the lighthouse at Tse-le, or Square Island. In thick or foggy weather the bell will be sounded *once every fifteen seconds*. A gong has replaced the bell at the lighthouse on Tiger or Pasyew Island, which in thick or foggy weather will be sounded *five times* in quick succession, at intervals of about *one minute*.

(No. 57.)—UNITED STATES—ALABAMA—MOBILE BAY.

(1.) Intended Alteration in Sand Island Light.

THE United States Government has given notice, that on the 1st day of September, 1873, the following alteration will be made in Sand Island light, west side of the entrance to Mobile Bay :—

The present light will be replaced by a new light, exhibited from a tower now in the course of erection in the middle of the island, and 230 yards W.N.W. from the present lighthouse. The light will be a *fixed* white light, elevated 132 feet above the high-water level of the sea, and in clear

weather should be seen from a distance of 17 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The tower, 140 feet high, is built of brick; conical in form, and will be painted black. Position (approximate) lat. $30^{\circ} 11' 20''$ N., long. $88^{\circ} 2'$ W.

Directions.—Being off the bar in 9 fathoms, bring Sand Island Lighthouse to bear N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., and steer on this course until over the bar and in $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms water, then steer N. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. until Sand Island bears West, passing midway between the island and Revenue Point shoal; the course from thence is N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., passing Mobile Point at a distance of one-third of a mile until Mobile Point Lighthouse bears S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., then steer N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. between the West Bank and the Middle Ground, when the course is N. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., 2 to 4 miles to the anchorage in Lower Fleet.

FLORIDA STRAIT.

(2.) *Beacon on Rebecca Shoal.*

Also, that an iron beacon, surmounted by a cylindrical cage, and painted black, has been erected on Rebecca Shoal, Florida Strait; in clear weather it should be seen from a distance of about 7 miles.

NEW JERSEY.

(3.) *Fog Bell at Bergen Point Lighthouse.*

Also, that a large fog bell, struck by machinery, has been placed at Bergen Point Lighthouse, entrance to Newark Bay, which in thick or foggy weather will be sounded at intervals of *fifteen seconds*.

2. A *fixed red* light on the extremity of the mole "Art," south-west of the town, visible from a distance of 3 miles. This light cannot be exhibited in bad weather.

Note.—Vessels from the south-eastward should sight the red light before entering the harbour.

CATTARO GULF.

(2.) *Harbour Light at Castel-Nuovo.*

Also that a *fixed red* harbour light is now exhibited from a lamp-post on the extremity of the new mole at Castel-Nuovo, Gulf of Cattaro; it is elevated 20 feet above the level of the sea, and should be seen from a distance of 2 miles.

GREECE—MARATHONISI.

(3.) *Fixed and Flashing Light on Crane Island.*

The Greek Government has given notice, that

a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Cranæ Island, Port of Marathonisi.

The light is a fixed light with *red and white flashes every minute*; it is elevated about 98 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

SARDINIA—SAN PIETRO ISLAND.

(4.) *Sunken Rock near Point Colonne.*

Information has been received of the existence of a sunken rock (Goffredo Rock) with 12 feet water on it, between Point Colonne and Point Genia, south end of San Pietro Island. It lies W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. from Point Colonne, distant nearly half a mile.

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above resolution:

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf, hereby order and direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other meetings for the transaction of any parochial business, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Dorking.

ARTICLE II.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
