Marine Department, Board of Trade, Whitehall Gardens, October 11, 1873.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, two Telegrams from Her Majesty's Secretary of Legation at Madrid, the first reporting that vessels from Liverpool, having sailed after the 29th ultimo, and those from St. Jean de Luz, arriving after the 1st instant, are subjected to three days' quarantine of observation, and that, in extreme cases of want of cleanliness, the vessel's crew may be sent to a foul lazaret; the second reporting that a quarantine of three days' observation is imposed on vessels from Bayonne, Bordeaux, and Marseilles, arriving in Spain after the 29th September; that in extreme cases of want of cleanliness they may be sent to a foul lazaret; that great vigilance is to be exercised as to vessels from Leghorn; and that vessels having sailed from Castel-a-Mare and from the Elbe after the 26th August last, will be sent to a foul lazaret.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Des-

patch from Her Majesty's Secretary of Legation at Madrid, enclosing copy and translation of four Orders which have been published in the Madrid Gazette, the first imposing rigorous quarantine on vessels which may have left Rouen after the 30th August last, and those from Singapore which may have sailed after the 27th July last; and quarantine of seven days at a foul lazaret on vessels which may have left the Spanish Antilles after the 15th August last, with a clean bill of health; the second subjecting to a rigorous quarantine vessels from the Seine and from the port of Naples, which may have put to sea after the 10th September; the third imposing rigorous quarantine on vessels from Helsingborg, from ports between Königsberg, and Libau, from Dresden, and from Austrian ports, which may have sailed after the 20th August last, and admitting to free pratique vessels from Lisbon; the fourth applying rigorous quarantine to vessels from Nioasta (Turkey in Europe), which may have put to sea after the 27th August last.
