THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Decree of the French Government, dated the 18th instant, modifying Article 3 of the Decree of the 25th August, 1861, as follows:—

Foreign wheat intended for grinding may be imported at all the Custom-houses open to the importation of cereals. The re-exportation of flour may only take place at the same Custom-houses through which the wheat was imported. The offices for re-exportation must be at warehousing ports or at Custom-houses open either to the transit or entry of merchandize taxed at more than 20 francs the 100 kilogrammes.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at the Hague, stating that no fresh cases of cholera having occurred at Memel since the 7th instant, vessels which have sailed from thence after that date will not be subjected to the quarantine regulations lately in force in the Netherlands; also that in consequence of the prevalence of cholera at Bergen, in Norway, all vessels which have left that port since the 9th instant will be subjected to quarantine on arrival in the ports of the Netherlands

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Depatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Copenhagen, stating that the Danish Government have, in date of the 21st instant, declared Naples and Bergen to be "infected" with cholera, and therefore all vessels now arriving in Danish ports from those places must hoist the quarantine flag, and be inspected by the Health Officer before any communication with the shore will be allowed; neglect to comply with these regulations will subject the offenders to a penalty of 200 rigs-dollars.


