THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Decree of the French Government, dated the 18th instant, modifying Article 3 of the Decree of the 25th August, 1861, as follows:—

Foreign wheat intended for grinding may be imported at all the Custom-houses open to the importation of cereals. The re-exportation of flour may only take place at the same Custom-houses through which the wheat was imported. The offices for re-exportation must be at warehousing ports or at Custom-houses open either to the transit or entry of merchandize taxed at more than 20 francs the 100 kilogrammes.
