Despatch from Her Majesty's Legation at Athens, stating that as the state of public health in the Province of Elis is declared to be excellent, arrivals from Catacolo were admitted to free pratique in Greek ports; also that no cases of sickness resembling cholera having been reported from Corfu lately, the quarantine of eleven days imposed on arrivals from that Island had been reduced to five days' of observation to last till the 3rd of November.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Bucharest, enclosing a translation of a Decree issued by the Roumanian Government, for the establishment of certain quay dues at Ibraila. A copy of the Decree is subjoined:

ART. I. The Commune of Ibraila is authorized to levy quay dues on all navigating vessels, sea, and river coasting vessels, namely, steam vessels, sailing vessels, schlepps, barges, and other similar vessels whencesoever arriving without distinction of flag, which shall make use of the quay at the Port of Ibraila, at the rate of twenty bani* per ton on the tonnage of the vessel, which shall be estimated according to the tonnage inscribed in the ship's register or certificate, when the whole of the merchandize is destined for that port; otherwise the tax shall be levied on the amount of merchandize unloaded or laden;

The following vessels without distinction of flag are exempt from quay dues:—

(a.) Vessels of war, mail and passenger vessels.

(b.) Vessels in ballast and unloading it in the port at fixed spots, and which ballast shall remain the property of the Commune.

(c.) Boats of the inhabitants of Ibraila, used for their private affairs in the harbour.

When any vessel, after being loaded and having paid the quay dues shall be obliged, either owing to the freezing of the river or other unforeseen circumstances to unload its cargo, there shall be no further tax levied either on its unloading or reloading.

ART. II. Our Minister, Secretary of State for the Department of the Interior, is entrusted with the execution of this Decree.
