Reat Preparations are making for the Reception of the Princess of Bavaria, who is expected here towards the end of Decem-

ber The Governor of Milan, after having held feveral Confultations with the Principal Officers of the Army about the new Levies, lis gone to visit the Frontier Places of that State. Vienna, November 4. Wirtsbourg, Novemb. 20. They have granted a Neutra-lity to the County of Meurs on the We are told from France, That there has been published an Ordinance by which the King declares, That whereas a third part of all Prizes taken by Privateers did heretofore belong to him, his Majesty, the more to Encourage his Subjects to fit out Ships against his Enemies, does order, that all the Prizes they shall take for the future shall entirely belong to them. Our Governor General has sent the Marquis de Bedmar to Nieuport, to view that place, and to give fuch Orders as he shall think necellary for its Security. And at the same time our Maistre de Camp General is gone to visit the Frontier places of this Province. We hear that great Preparations are making in all Parts of the Empire, against the Spring.
