The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Charles Carthew, Esq., who is actually and entirely employed in the service of His Imperial Majesty the Sultan beyond the Queen's dominions, and who in the year 1861 received Her Majesty's permission to accept and wear the Insignia of the Fifth Class of the Imperial Order of the Medjidie, Her Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the Fourth Class of the said Imperial Order of the Medjidie, which the Sultan hath been pleased to confer upon him.

By virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the tenth and fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out writs for the election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess."

I do hereby give notice, that it hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, that the Right Honourable William Monsell, late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the county of Limerick, is become a Peer of the United Kingdom, and that a writ of Summons

hath been issued to him under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom to summon him to Parliament, and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for said county, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.
