

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Takeley, in the county of Essex, and in the diocese of Rochester, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all those annual tithe commutation rent-charges which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us: To have and to hold the said annual tithe commutation rent-charges to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the said annual tithe commutation rent-charges shall be and be taken to be in lieu of and in full substitution for the annual sum or stipend of fifty-five pounds, heretofore payable by us, the said Commissioners, or by our lessees, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage, in respect of the rectorial tithe rent-charge arising within the said parish of Takeley, and formerly belong to the Bishoprick of London: And provided also, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said annual tithe commutation rent-charges, for and in respect of the period intervening between the twenty-fifth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of five hundred pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the rectory of Hinton-on-the-Green, in the county of Gloucester, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage of Hinton-on-the-Green, to meet such benefaction, one other capital sum of five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a new parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Hinton-on-the-Green.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, con-

sisting of seven hundred and ten square yards of land, which has been permanently secured to the vicarage or benefice of Christ Church, Chadderton, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, and of a further benefaction, consisting of two hundred pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the same vicarage or benefice, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage or benefice of Christ Church, Chadderton, to meet such benefactions, one capital sum of three hundred and forty-eight pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage or benefice, according to plans and a specification approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage or benefice of Christ Church, Chadderton.
