A PROCLAMATION,

*For Dissolving the present Parliament and
Declaring the calling of another.*

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to dissolve this present Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday, the fifth day of February next: We do for that end publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the said Parliament accordingly; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for shires and burghs, of the House of Commons are discharged from their meeting and attendance on the said Thursday, the fifth day of February next; and We, being desirous and resolved as soon as may be, to meet Our people, and to have their advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving subjects Our Royal will and pleasure to call a new Parliament; and do hereby further declare, that, with the advice of Our Privy Council, We have given order that Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, and Our Chancellor of Ireland, do, respectively, upon notice thereof, forthwith issue out writs in due form, and according to law, for calling a new Parliament: and We do hereby also, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our United Kingdom, require writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by Our said Chancellors respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons, who are to serve in the said Parliament, to be duly returned to, and give their attendance in, Our said Parliament; which writs are to be returnable on Thursday, the fifth day of March next.

Given at Our Court at *Osborne House, Isle of Wight*, this twenty-sixth day of *January*, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and in the thirty-seventh year of Our reign.

A PROCLAMATION,

*In order to the Electing and Summoning the
Sixteen Peers of Scotland.*

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS We have in Our Council thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom

of Great Britain and Ireland, on Thursday, the fifth day of March next ensuing the date hereof; in order, therefore, to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood House, in Edinburgh, on Wednesday, the eighteenth day of February next, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers, to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament, by open election, and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers, and producing a mandate in writing, duly signed before witnesses, and both the constituent and proxy being qualified according to law), and the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes; and immediately after such election made and duly examined, to certify the names of the Sixteen Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said city, to take especial care to preserve the peace thereof, during the time of the said election, and to prevent all manner of riots, tumults, disorders, and violence whatsoever. And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market-Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, ten days, at least, before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such election.

WHEREAS by Section 14 of an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the 32nd and 33rd years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "The Courts of Justice (Salaries and Funds Act,) 1869," the Treasury, by which is meant the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury for the time being, or any two or more of them, are authorized and empowered from time to time by Order made with the concurrence of the Lord Chancellor, and also with the concurrence of the Master of the Rolls, in the case of officers who are appointed or whose salaries are fixed by the Master of the Rolls, either solely or jointly with the Lord Chancellor, to determine the conditions on which the officers [of the Court of Chancery appointed after the commencement of the Act above-mentioned] are to hold their offices. And whereas, on the second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, Kenyon Bethell Otter was appointed to the office of Sworn Clerk to the Examiners of the Court of Chancery, and became on such appointment an officer of the Court of Chancery within the meaning of the said section, and liable to the operation of the same. Now we, the undersigned, being two of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, with the concurrence of the Right Honourable Roundell, Baron Selborne, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and with the concurrence of the Right Honourable Sir George Jessel, Master of the Rolls, signified by their respective signatures hereto, do by this Order under our hands, made in pursuance of the aforesaid section of the Act before-mentioned, determine that the said Kenyon Bethell Otter holds his said office of Sworn Clerk to the Examiners of the Court of Chancery on a salary of three hundred pounds per annum, commencing from the said second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and payable quarterly on the sixteenth day of March, the sixteenth day of June, the sixteenth day of September, and the sixteenth day of December, so long as it shall continue to be payable, such office and salary respectively to be subject to revision hereafter, and the said Kenyon Bethell Otter to have no claim to compensation if the result of such revision or of any steps which may be taken upon the coming into operation of the Supreme Court of Judicature Act, 1873, should lead to the abolition of the said office, or to any alteration of the salary or emoluments thereof.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 11.)—ENGLAND—EAST COAST.

Establishment of East Goodwin Light-Vessel.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 104, dated 24th October, 1873, on the intended establishment of a light-vessel, eastward of the Goodwin Sands:—

The Trinity House, London, has, in conformity therewith, given further notice, that the light-

vessel, *East Goodwin*, has been placed in position on the east side of the sands, and the light is now exhibited.

The light is a *revolving green light*, attaining its greatest brilliancy *every fifteen seconds*; it is elevated 38 feet above the level of the sea.

The vessel has her name painted on her sides in large letters, and carries a diamond-shaped beacon at the mast-head. She is moored in 30 fathoms at low water springs, with the following bearings; viz:—

S.E. Goodwin Buoy, W.N.W. $1\frac{1}{10}$ miles.

The Goodwin Safety Beacon, N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. $2\frac{2}{10}$ miles.

East Goodwin Buoy, N. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

North Sand Head Light-vessel, N. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

These bearings place the light-vessel in lat. $51^{\circ} 13' N.$, long. $1^{\circ} 36' 25'' E.$

Alteration in Position of South Sand Head Light-Vessel.

Also, in accordance with the same notice, the South Sand Head Light-vessel has been moved, and now lies in 14 fathoms at low water springs, with the following marks and bearings:—

South Foreland Lights in line, W $\frac{3}{4}$ N., Low Light distant $3\frac{3}{10}$ miles.

Deal Bank Buoy, N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. $4\frac{1}{10}$ miles.

South Goodwin Buoy, E. by N. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. $2\frac{9}{10}$ miles.

East Goodwin Light-vessel, E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. $6\frac{6}{10}$ miles.

These bearings place the light-vessel in lat. $51^{\circ} 9' N.$, long. $1^{\circ} 28' E.$

New Buoy off South-West end of Goodwin Sands.

Notice is also given, that a new buoy has been placed off the south-west end of the Goodwin Sands between the South Sand Head Light-Vessel and the Bunt Head Buoy.

The buoy is a *black can* buoy called the *S.W. Goodwin*, moored in 13 fathoms at low water springs, with the following marks and bearings:—

East end of Admiralty Pier, Dover, just open of South Foreland, W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

South Sand Head Light-Vessel, S.S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. 2 miles.

Deal Bank Buoy, N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. $3\frac{1}{10}$ miles.

Bunt Head Buoy, N. by E. $2\frac{1}{10}$ miles.

South-East Goodwin Buoy.
