

additional Major and four additional Minor; and so on for every diminution of 10 Old Foundacioners two additional Major and four additional Minor; so that when there are less than 10 Old Foundacioners there may be the full number of Major and Minor.

XIV.

In order to be admitted a Minor Foundacioner, a boy must be above 12 and less than 14 years old. He must produce testimonials of good character, and must satisfy the Head Master at the entrance examination that he has attained the standard of proficiency required by the regulations of the Governing Body in force for the time being. Any boy already in the school who is otherwise qualified may compete for admission at such entrance examination.

XV.

In order to be admitted a Major Foundacioner, a boy must be qualified in the same manner as a Minor Foundacioner, and must also have attended, during the two years preceding his admission, the subordinate school hereinafter mentioned.

XVI.

So long as there shall not be any boys qualified according to the last preceding statute, to become Major Foundacioners, and if at any time thereafter there be an insufficient number of boys so qualified to fill vacancies, two Minor Foundacioners may be appointed instead of one Major Foundacioner.

XVII.

In the appointment of Minor Foundacioners if the number of boys qualified exceed the number of vacancies, the boy that stands highest in the entrance examination shall have the preference. In the appointment of Major Foundacioners, if the number of boys qualified exceed the number of vacancies, the boy that stands highest in the last preceding examination of the subordinate school shall have the preference.

XVIII.

No Old Foundacioner, nor Major or Minor Foundacioner, if his parents, or in the case of an orphan, his guardians, or person standing to him in *loco parentis*, shall cease to reside in or within five miles of Rugby, shall remain on the foundation beyond the end of the then current term.

XIX.

THE SCHOLARS.

An examination shall be held once a year for the election of scholars by competition. The scholars shall be distinguished into major and minor scholars. The examinations shall be conducted by examiners to be named or approved by the Governing Body in such subjects and in such manner as shall be determined by regulation.

XX.

All boys, whether already in the school or not, who shall have testimonials of good character, and shall be fully 12 years old on the 1st of January and not more than 15 on the 1st of July in the year in which the examination is held, shall be eligible for scholarships.

XXI.

Every major scholar shall have the instruction of the school free of all charge, and a sum equal

to the fees required by the regulations from a day boy shall be paid on his behalf to the tuition fund out of the income of the school.

XXII.

Every minor scholar shall pay half the fees required by the regulations from day-boys, and the other half shall be paid on his behalf to the tuition fund out of the income of the school.

XXIII.

Three major scholarships and six minor scholarships shall be awarded every year, if there be that number of candidates approved by the examiners, but the Governing Body shall have power in case of equality or approximate equality of candidates to authorize two minor scholarships to be awarded instead of one major.

XXIV.

At least two major and two minor scholarships shall be given for proficiency in Classics. The other scholarships may be given for proficiency in such subjects as the Governing Body shall from time to time determine. But no scholarship shall be awarded to a candidate who does not in the opinion of the examiners show a sufficient knowledge of the other subjects studied in the school besides that to which the scholarship is assigned.

XXV.

The same boy shall not hold at one time a major scholarship and a minor scholarship; but a boy elected to a minor scholarship for proficiency in one subject may be elected to one other minor scholarship for proficiency in another subject. A Minor Foundacioner may hold one minor scholarship. Any Foundacioner may be elected either to a major scholarship or to two minor scholarships, but in either case he shall cease to be a Foundacioner.

XXVI.

The existing senior scholarships shall from the commencement of the next term, after these Statutes come into force, absolutely cease, and the holders thereof shall be at once appointed to major scholarships.

XXVII.

The emoluments of scholarships of the existing junior scholars shall be paid out of the income of the school.

XXVIII.

GENERAL RULES RESPECTING THE FOUNDACIONERS AND SCHOLARS.

If a Foundacioner or a scholar attains the age of 19 between 1st January and the end of the summer term, he shall leave the school at the end of the summer term; if he attain the age of 19 between the end of the summer term and 31st December, he shall leave the school at the end of the winter term.

XXIX.

No boy, unless he be an Old Foundacioner, shall remain on the foundation or continue to hold a scholarship after he has attained the age of 18 while below the sixth form, or 17 while below the upper school, or 16 while below the upper middle school, or 15 while below the lower middle school, beyond the end of the then current year.

XXX.

In case of the grave misconduct of any foundacioner or scholar, the Head Master shall have
