#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force, for Her Majesty's Levees.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department), Whitehall Gardens, April 27, 1874.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Monte Video, stating that the quarantine regulations in the ports of that Republic imposed upon vessels arriving from Argentine ports had been relaxed (excepting those upon vessels arriving from Buenos Ayres), but are again in full force on account of an outbreak of cholera in Entre Rios.

It is also stated that the authorities at Buenos Ayres had, on account of the exception of that port from the number of those the vessels arriving from which had met with some relaxation of the quarantine regulations in Monte Video, declared all Argentine ports closed against vessels arriving from all Uruguayan ports, though the latter are not infected. This prohibition does not apply to packets or to ships from the ocean calling for orders at Monte Video.

As the cholera was diminishing at Buenos Ayres it was hoped that the above arrangements would not continue long in force.
