THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

KILKHAMPTON FAIRS.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, J, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. A representation has been duly made to me by the Reverend the Lord John Thynne, as owner, that Fairs have been annually held in the parish of Kilkhampton, in the Stratton Petty Sessional Division of the county of Cornwall, on Holy Thursday, and on the third Thursday after Holy Thursday, respectively, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs should in future be held on certain

other days in the year, as follows:—The Fair hitherto held on Holy Thursday to be henceforth held on Thursday before Holy Thursday; and the Fair hitherto held on the third Thursday after Holy Thursday to be henceforth held on the first Thursday in July.

2. On the 10th day of July, 1874, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the said proposed alteration of the days for the holding of the said Fairs respectively.

The Monmouthshire Railway and Canal Company (in this Certificate called "the Company") are hereby authorised to raise for the purposes of their undertaking, in addition to the capital already authorised to be raised by them, any further sums, not exceeding in the whole seventy-five thousand pounds, by the issue of new shares or new stock, either ordinary or preference, or partly ordinary and partly preference, at the option of the Company.
