Board of Trade (Harbour Department), Whitehall Gardens, June 29, 1874.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General in Egypt, stating that a disease, supposed to be plague, had broken out at Merdj, in the Province of Benghazi. The Egyptian Government have consequently subjected all arrivals from the infected country to a quarantine of ten days. A Sanitary Commission has been sent from Benghazi to report on the matter, and in the event of the disease proving to be the plague, it is probable that a resolution will be passed by the Egyptian authorities to repel all arrivals by land and sea from the coast as far as Tripoli.
