And whereas by an Order dated the 29th day

ORDERS issued by the Local Government of April, 1871, the Poor Law Board appointed Hugh Lloyd Roberts, of the Middle Temple, London, Barrister-at-Law, to the office of Auditor, for the Metropolitan Audit District;

And whereas by certain Orders dated respectively the 20th day of June, 1872, and the 20th day of September, 1873, the Local Government Board added the Saint George's, the Saint Olave's, the Saint Saviour's, and the Wandsworth and Clapham Unions, and the parishes of Saint Mary, Lambeth; and Saint Pancras, to the Metropolitan Audit District;

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, under the authority of the statutes in that behalf, hereby order that, from and after the 25th day of July instant, the Hackney, Poplar, Stepney and Whitechapel Unions, and the Stepney and Whitechapel Unions, and the parishes of Saint John, Hampstead; Saint Leonard, Shoreditch; Saint Matthew, Bethnal Green; and Saint George-in-the-East, and the hamlet of Mile End Old Town, shall be separated from the North-East Metropolitan Auditor's District, and added to the Metropolitan Audit District.

And whereas by the above-recited Order bearing date the 27th day of April, 1871, the Poor Law Board directed that the Auditor of the Metropolitan Audit District should, twice in every year, that is to say, as soon as might be after the 25th day of March and the 29th day of September, examine, audit, and allow or disallow the accounts of the said several unions, and also of the said several parishes therein before combined, and of the several parishes comprised in the said unions, according to the laws in force for the time being for the administration of the relief of the poor:
