THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Madrid, stating that on and after the 1st of next October, the use of the Signals of Distress and Signals for Pilots set forth in Schedules 1 and 2 of "The Merchant Shipping Acts Amendment Act, 1873," will be obligatory in the Spanish Dominions.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, dated the 15th instant, stating that all vessels arriving in Turkish ports from Bengazi will be subjected to fifteen days' quarantine on account of supposed plague.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-

General in Egypt, reporting that in consequence of a supposed outbreak of plague at Bengazi, the Egyptian Government have decided to repel all arrivals by sea from the Regency as far as Tripoli.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Notice which has been issued by the Portuguese Government declaring the ports of Tripoli "infected" with the plague since the 9th ultimo.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Notice issued by the Spanish Government imposing fifteen days' rigorous quarantine on all vessels arriving from Tripoli on and after the 12th instant, owing to the appearance of the Levantine plague in Tripoli.
