There is a Report, that all the French Effects have been feized in Portugal, by way of Reprizal, for the Goods which the Merchants of Portugal have lost in the Dutch Vessels taken by the French Privateers, and which were condemn'd for good Prize, notwithstanding the Representations of the Portugal Minister residing here.
