In the Matter of "The Abandonment of Railways Act, 1850," and "The Railway Companies Act, 1867," and of the Barry Railway Company.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that the Board of Trade, by a warrant, dated the 5th day of August, 1874, and made in pursuance of "The Abandonment of Railways Act, 1850," and "The Railways Companies Act, 1867," have ordered and declared that the railways by the "Barry Railway Act, 1865," "The Barry Railway (Alteration) Act, 1866," "The Barry Railway (Extension) Act, 1866," and by the certificate of the Board of Trade, dated the 15th July,

1867, authorized to be made, shall be abandoned by the Barry Railway Company, that is to say :—

"No. 1. A railway, commencing in the parish of Peterston-Super-Ely, in the county of Glamorgan, by a junction with the South Wales Railway, at a point 500 yards, or thereabouts, in an easterly direction from the Peterston Station of that railway, and terminating in the parish of Cadoxton-juxta-Barry, in the same county.

"No. 2. A railway, commencing in the parish of Cadoxton-juxta-Barry, by a junction with the intended Railway No. 1, and terminating in the parish of Sully, in the said county of Glamorgan.

"A railway, 8 miles, 3 furlongs, and 66 yards, or thereabouts in length, commencing by a junction with the South Wales Railway, of the Great Western Railway Company, near the Peterston Station, and terminating in the parish of Merthyr-dovan, in the county of Glamorgan.

"A railway, 3 miles, 3 furlongs, and 69 yards, or thereabouts, in length, commencing by a junction with the railway of the Company, in the parish of Cadoxton-juxta-Barry, in the county of Glamorgan, and terminating by a junction with the railway of the Penarth Company, in the parish of Llan-dough, in the same county.
