(No. 107.)—FRANCE, NORTH COAST.

Alteration in Lights, entrance of River Canche.

THE French Government has given notice, that from the 15th September, 1874, the following alterations will be made in the lights at the entrance of the River Canche, north coast of France, viz:—

1. Two leading lights will be exhibited from lighthouses recently erected on the sand hills at Carniers, north side of entrance.

The upper light will be a *fixed white* light, elevated 121 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fifth order.

The lower light will be a *fixed red* light, bearing west southerly, distant 800 yards from the upper light and visible through an arc of 15 degrees on either side of the line of direction of the leading lights, but will only be lighted when there is a depth of at least $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet over the banks at the entrance of the channel; it will be elevated 54 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 9 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors, of the fifth order.

The upper lighthouse is of iron, and painted white; the lower one is a square tower of masonry, painted white.

Position of the upper lighthouse, lat. $50^{\circ} 33' 5''$ N., long. $0^{\circ} 43' 22''$ W.

2. Also, that from the same date the *fixed white* light now exhibited on Lornel Point will be discontinued.
