THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs Despatches from Her Majesty's Agent at Alexandria, stating that the Egyptian authorities have decided that the presence on board of any vessel whatsoever of pilgrims or merchandise from the Regency of Tripoli, would, in consequence of the outbreak of plague in the Regency, cause such vessel to be absolutely repelled from Egyptian territory. Also, that in consequence of the outbreak of a disease, supposed to be plague, in the neighbourhood of Mecca, it has been decided to subject all vessels arriving from the Arabian coast of the Red Sea to a quarantine of twenty-one days.
