BY an Order made by the Vice-Chancellor Sir Charles Hall in the above matter, dated the 19th day of August, 1874, on the petitions of Charles Heaton Hinde, Joseph Farmer Milne, John Sudlow, and Joseph Harris. of Altrincham, in the county of Chester, Attorneys and Solicitors, practising under the style or firm of Nicholls, Hinde, and Company, it was ordered that the said Ellesmere Foundry and Engineering Company Limited be wound up by this Court under the provisions of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867.
