No. 43.—GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to direct that vessels arriving from the Regency of Tripoli and from the Arabian Red Sea Ports, be allowed to enter the quarantine harbour to discharge unsusceptible goods, on condition of leaving the Island immediately afterwards.

Vessels originally coming from the above-mentioned places, notwithstanding that they touch at intermediate ports, will be subjected to the aforesaid treatment.

Passengers and susceptible goods, animals included, will not be allowed to be landed.

Bales of esparto grass will be received in the lazaretto for trans-shipment.

Intended Light-vessel—Weser River Entrance.

THE German Government has given notice, that from the beginning of the month of October, 1874, it is intended to place a light-vessel off the entrance of the Weser River.

The light-vessel will exhibit three *fixed* white lights at the same height on separate masts, and
