HATTERAS INLET—PAMPLICO SOUND.

Flashing Light on Oliver Reef.

THE United States Government has given notice, that from the 1st day of October, 1874, a *flashing* light will be exhibited from a screw pile lighthouse recently erected on Oliver Reef, Hatteras Inlet, Pamplico Sound.

The light will be a *flashing-red* light, showing flashes at intervals of *thirty seconds*; between the flashes there will be a total eclipse.

The light will be elevated 36 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 11 miles.
