

From the wreck Flores Island bears N. 58° E., El Cerro (the mount) light, No. 27° W., Brava Point, N. 7° E., 6½ miles.

One of the masts of the wreck is unstepped, but being anchored by the wire rigging, floats at present with its head about ten or twelve feet above water, and serves as a beacon. The head of the other mast is barely awash.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation, 9° Easterly in 1874.]

Fixed Light at the Entrance of Rock Harbour.

INFORMATION has been received, that from the 15th day of August, 1874, a light was exhibited from the old tower on the south-west side of the entrance to Rock Harbour, Royale Island.

The light is a *fixed red* light, elevated 70 feet above the level of the lake, and in clear weather should be visible from a distance of 13 miles.

The tower is painted gray, and attached to the keeper's dwelling.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Prittlewell, in the county of Essex;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Rochford Union, in the same county;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Prittlewell, in the county of Essex, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, it was resolved;—

"That it is expedient that the Vestry Meetings and Vestry Clerks' Act of 1850 should be applied to and put in force in this parish, so far as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, and that the Churchwardens make the necessary application to the Local Government Board for an Order for the above purpose."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above resolution:

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intitled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Prittlewell.

ARTICLE II.—An annual salary at the rate of thirty pounds shall be paid by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish to the Vestry Clerk to be elected under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act.

ARTICLE III.—The salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of "The Apportionment Act, 1870."

ARTICLE IV.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
