Board of Trade, (Harbour Department), Whitehall Gardens, November 23, 1874.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General in Egypt, that the quarantine regulations recently adopted against vessels and goods arriving from Tripoli, or the Red Sea coast of Arabia, are still in force on account of further unfavourable reports as to the existence of plague in those countries, and that, should the malady increase, more restrictive measures will be adopted.
