THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, stating that, in consequence of the appearance of yellow fever at Charleston (U.S.A.), all arrivals from that port which have sailed since the 23rd of October last will be subjected to quarantine; and that all arrivals from the ports of Para and Rio Janeiro, and from the ports of the Argentine Republic which have left those ports since the 23rd September and the 15th of October last, respectively, will be admitted to free pratique.
