An O R D E R Of His Highnels the Prince of ORANGE.

Warfar, Decemb. 3. The King of Poland, according to the laft Letters from Zokkien, continued Rill there with the whole Gourt. The Palatin of Ruffis the Crown General had received advice; that the Tartars were preparing to make new Incurfions into the Krontier, Provinces, upon which he had fent to the Nobility to put themselves in Arms for their Security. The Dyet of Great Poland is ended very quielly; That of Putflia cannot meet, for that the Principal Cities, as Therm, Blbing, and Dantaick have exculed themselves from fending any Deputies thither. The Dyet of this City which reaffembled the 30th paft, is broke up again, without chopping any Deputies to be fent to the General Dyet.

Vienna, December 19. The Secretary Expello is arrived here from Penze, with the necellary Infiructions for the hearing the Proposals of the Turkish Ambasiladors; And a Conference has been already held on that Subject. It's believed, the fait Am-

baffadors will now very quickly be admined Audience of the Emperor, but the Imperial Mini-fters will not enter into any Negotiation with them, till the arrival of the Euvoy from Poland In the mean time, daily Confeltations are held here, m Order to a vigorous profecution of the War again& France. Belides the 10 Imperial Regionents. that are already in Bohemia, four more are ordered to march that way, who are all to Winter in that Kingdom, and on the Frontiers of the Empire, that they may be ready to joyn with the Forces of the Circles of Bavaria, Franconia and Suabia, and aCt as there thall be occasion, till fuch time in the reft of the Imperial Troops do arrive, which will form a very confiderable Army on the Rhin The Proposals of the Baron de Heusler, for the tailing two Regiments of Dragoons have been accepted; And feveral other Perfons of Quality are dreating with to raife Regiments on the tame Footen There is a discourse, that the Emperor will demolish the Fortifications of divers places in Hungary, that he may draw out the Garifons to ceinforce his Armies; intending only to maintain the most important Frontier places. The Duke of Lorrain is perfectly recovered, and is expected here towards: the end of The Emperor has written to all the next Month. the Electors and other Princes of the Empire; to fend away the French Ministers from their Gourte. We have no other News from Hungary, than that the Imperial Troops are every where very quiet in their Winter Quarters.

Francfort, Decemb. 18. The Troops of the Eledor of Saxony, are at prefent in the Neighborhood of Hailbron, Thole of the Duke of Saxe Gotha are on their March to joyn the Forces of Franconin, under the Command of the Count de Tingen, The Letters from Vienna Ipeak very muchoff a Peace with the Turks.

Francfort, Decemb. 25. We hear from Ransbonne, that the Count de Crecy, Pleniporentriary of France, parted from thence the roth Inflant. The Troops of Hannuer and Caffel, are Quattered along the Maine, and in Merteravia, and those of Saxony are entred into Franconia, their Head-Quarter being at Sabwennfurt, and their Artillery at Kareing.
