THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General in Egypt, stating that in consequence of the reported disappearance of plague in Tripoli, all arrivals from that Regency with clean bills of health, will be admitted to free pratique after a short quarantine of observation and medical inspection, except in case of crowded vessels ("Masses"), when the quarantine of observation will be extended according to circumstances.

In case any vessels should arrive with foul bills of health, they will be subjected to the regulations at present in force, and placed in quarantine for 31 days.

ORDER issued by the Local Government Board under "The Public Health Act, 1872," investing Rural Sanitary Authority with Urban Powers:—

Penzance-Union.

Paul and Saint Just-in-Penwith Parishes.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Penzance Union, in the county of Cornwall, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union: And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 23 of the Public Health Act, 1872, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, on the application of the Authority of any Rural Sanitary District, by Order, to be published in the London Gazette, or in such other manner as they may direct, invest such Authority with all or any of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority; and that such investment may be made either unconditionally or subject to any conditions to be specified by the Board as to the time, portion of district, or manner during, at, and in which such powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations are to be exercised and attach;

And whereas the Guardians of the Poor of the Penzance Union, in the county of Cornwall, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union, have applied to the Local Government Board to issue an Order investing them, as such Sanitary Authority, with certain of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority as regards the parishes of Paul and Saint Just-in-Penwith, in the said Union:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, having duly considered the said application, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, invest the Guardians of the Poor of the Penzance Union, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, from and after the 1st day of January, 1875, with all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations

of an Urban Sanitary Authority, as regards the parishes of Paul and Saint Just-in-Penwith, with reference to making and enforcing bylaws, and otherwise, in respect to the following matters, viz. :—

In respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 32 of the Local Government Act, 1858, so far as the powers under that section are not already conferred upon the said Sanitary Authority in pursuance of Section 8 of the Public Health Act, 1872, and Section 5 of the Sanitary Act, 1868.

In respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1858.

And We hereby direct the said Guardians to cause this our Order to be published once in some newspaper circulated within the Rural Sanitary District of the said Union, before the expiration of one calendar month from the date hereof.

Chelsea Waterworks.

(New Works; Diversion of Water from the River Thames; Purchase of Lands; Further Money Powers; Amendment of Acts; and other Purposes.)

APPLICATION is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, by the Governor and Company of Chelsea Waterworks (hereinafter called "the Company"), for an Act to effect the objects, or some of the objects, following (that is to say)—

1. To authorise the Company to make and maintain the following waterworks, and works in connection therewith, in the county of Surrey; viz:—

(a.) An engine house, with all necessary engines and conveniences, to be situate in the parish

of West Molesey, otherwise West Moulsey, in the north-eastern corner of a field lately agreed to be purchased by the Company, and in the occupation of Messrs. John Aird and Sons, and which field abuts towards the east on the reservoirs of the Lambeth Waterworks Company, nearly opposite Sunbury Court, and towards the north on the River Thames.

(b.) A conduit or line of pipes (No. 1), wholly situate in the parish of West Molesey, otherwise West Moulsey, aforesaid, commencing at a point on the bed or shore of the River Thames, about two chains westward from the north-east corner of the field above mentioned, and terminating within the said intended engine-house, at a point about two chains, in a south-easterly direction, from the commencement of the said conduit or line of pipes No. 1.

(c.) A conduit or line of pipes, No. 2, commencing in the last-mentioned parish at the intended engine-house firstly above described, and terminating in the township or district of Saint Mark, Surbiton, in the parish of Kingston-upon-Thames, in the existing waterworks of the Company, at a point about 30 yards, north-west, from the junction of Brighton-road with the London and Portsmouth-road.

The proposed conduit or line of pipes, No. 2, will be made or pass from, in, through, or into the several parishes or townships following, or some or one of them; that is to say:— West Molesey, otherwise West Moulsey, Walton-upon-Thames, East Molesey, otherwise East Moulsey, Thames Ditton, Long Ditton, Kingston-upon-Thames, and Saint Mark's, Surbiton.

(d.)
