THE Queen has been pleased to appoint Sir John Hawkshaw, Knt., one of the Honorary Councillors of the Institution of Civil Engineers, to be Her Majesty's Commissioner for the purpose of inquiring as to what Towns and Places contribute to the pollution of the River Clyde and its tributaries; and how and by what means the Sewage of such Towns and Places and the refuse arising from industrial processes and manufactures carried on within the same can be utilized or got rid of without risk to the Public Health, or serious injury to such processes and manufactures otherwise than by discharge into the River Clyde and its tributaries or be rendered harmless before reaching them; and also for the purpose of inquiring into the best means of otherwise securing the purification of the said River and its Tributaries, and of remedying any evils or inconveniences arising from its present polluted state.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department), Whitehall Gardens, December 21, 1874.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General in Egypt, stating that in consequence of the reported disappearance of plague in Tripoli, all arrivals from that Regency with clean bills of health, will be admitted to free pratique after a short quarantine of observation and medical inspection, except in case of crowded vessels ("Masses"), when the quarantine of observation will be extended according to circumstances.

In case any vessels should arrive with foul bills of health, they will be subjected to the regulations at present in force, and placed in quarantine for 31 days.
