THE Queen has been graciously pleased to give orders for the appointment of Francis Philip Cunliffe Owen, Esq., sometime Secretary to the Royal Commission for the Vienna Universal Exhibition of 1873, to be an Ordinary Member of the Civil Division of the Third Class, or Companions of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath.

By virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-second year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to extend the Act of the twenty-fourth year of King George the Third, chapter twenty-six, for issuing writs during any recess of the House of Commons, whether by prorogation or adjournment;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess."

I do hereby give notice, that it hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, in the manner required by the said Act, that the Right Honourable John Thomas Ball, late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the College of the Holy Trinity at Dublin, hath accepted the office of Lord High Chancellor of Ireland, and has been gazetted thereto in the Dublin Gazette, dated the 1st day of January, 1875, and has thereby vacated his seat; and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown, to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said College, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.
